All of a sudden he thought of a wonderful idea... He would go to the race and run. He knew he was as fast as a dingo.



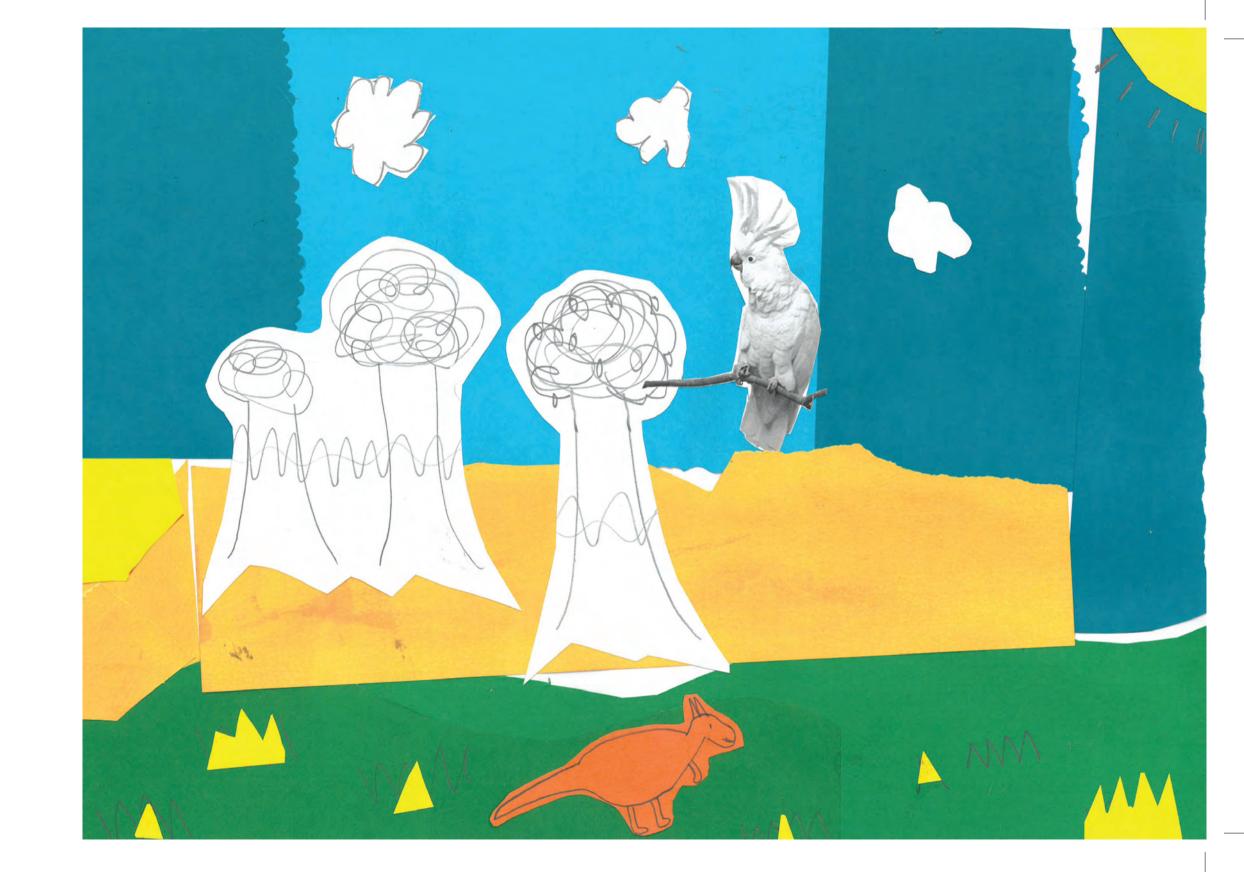

Then something really bad happened... He hasn't seen this track before. What was he going to do? He looked in and out of trees. Here and there but he still couldn't find his way.



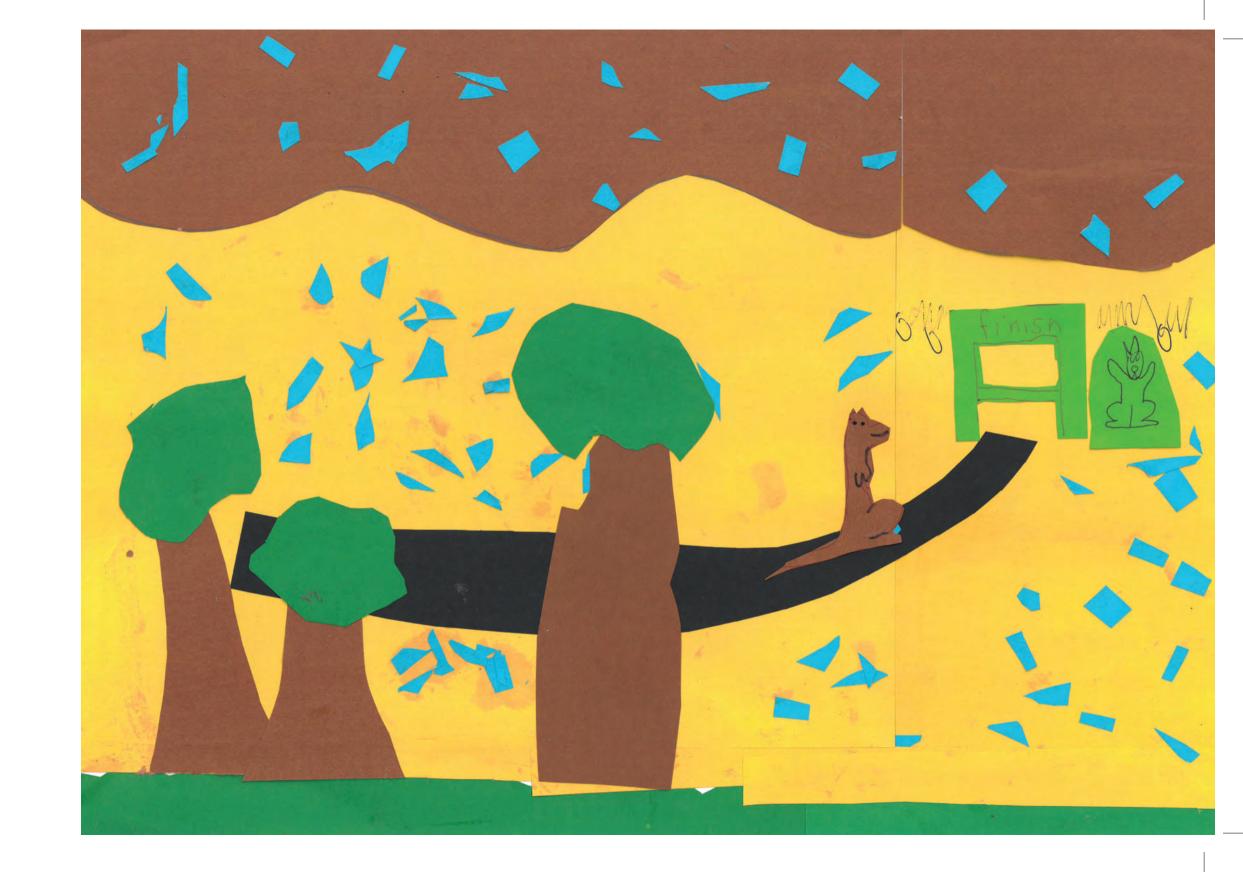
